Day One, Monday March 25, 2013

A) 2012 IECC Fundamentals: - Richard Truitt

Participants will be better able to understand and apply the critical concepts of the 2012 International Energy Conservation Code. These concepts provide a basis for the correct use of the code in the design, plan review, inspection, and analysis of projects. It will provide a clear understanding and correct use of the requirements identified by these basic code provisions, tables and categorizations. Participants will apply the code in clear-cut situations and build their understanding of the intent of the code when asked to make code compliance decisions. AIA 6 credits 0.6 CEU's

B) 2009 ICC IRC Performing Residential Plan Review: 2 day class (day 1) – John Gibson * Space is limited for this course so sign – up early *

Provides a procedure for reviewing residential building plans and specifications based on Chapters 1 through 10 of the 2009 IRC. Allows participant to practice a building plan review during the seminar using actual construction documents and a plan review record. AIA 12 Credits 1.2 CEU's

C) 2009 ICC IBC Fundamentals non-structural Provisions: - John Farinelli

This seminar focuses on the basic nonstructural concepts of the 2009 International Building Code® (IBC®). These concepts provide a basis for the correct utilization of the code. A clear understanding of the identified requirements allows the code user to apply the IBC in specific situations and helps to build an understanding of the intent of the code when asked to make a judgment on code compliance. This course will also help the code user to correctly locate and recognize the interrelatedness of code requirements, as well as to begin to develop a procedure for applying them. It will address the organization of the code and the interrelation of the IBC with the family of International Codes® (I-Codes®). AIA 6 Credits 0.6 CEU's

Day Two, Tuesday March 26, 2013

A) 2009 IBC Fundamentals Structural Provisions: - John Farinelli

This seminar examines structural provision requirements of the 2009 International Building Code® (IBC®) and addresses major elements, including structural loads, foundations, concrete, masonry, steel and wood. The seminar presents a general overview of the most significant structural topics of the code and standards.

B) 2009 ICC IRC Performing Residential Plan Review: 2 day class (Day 2) – John Gibson

Provides a procedure for reviewing residential building plans and specifications based on Chapters 1 through 10 of the 2009 IRC. Allows participant to practice a building plan review during the seminar using actual construction documents and a plan review record.

C) NSSA Sign Code Seminar: - Raymond Denault, Jeffrey Bauman, Major Clark, Kenneth Peskin

Attendees to the program will learn:

- *Different on-premise sign types: freestanding/pylon/monument and building signage*
- *Variations in sign faces; illumination options; exterior and interior lighting*
- *Sign vocabulary, definitions and technical information*
- *The appropriate use of electronic message centers*
- *The purpose of signs and the relationship between signage and small business success*
- *The economic benefits of small business success and the community tax base*
- *Facts concerning signage and traffic safety*
- *What constitutes sign codes that comply with civil rights (free speech) and the legal issues involved with sign codes*
- *The first, fourth and fifteenth Amendments will be reviewed as well as Federal trademark law.*
- *How waiting periods and permit fees affect businesses*
- *Sample sign codes will be evaluated to ensure content neutrality and adherence to civil rights*
- *How to turn restrictive sign codes into civil rights compliant sign codes.*
